
# Student growth

## Athletics Celebrations

This year at MRCS the high school athletics teams did exceptionally well! With many sports teams and high spirits we ended the year with not only awards and trophies under our belt but also high praises regarding our sportsmanship.

This year we had four of our senior teams make it to provincials. For volleyball, our senior boys team headed to Nanaimo and our senior girls went to Prince George to play in provincials! In March, our senior girls basketball team went to Nanaimo for the championships and then in late spring our Sr Ultimate Frisbee team played in provincials locally in Surrey.

Our athletics program was also awarded Most Sportsmanlike over eight times across all of the teams and seasons. This accurately reflects the intentions of our teams; to play with compassion for others and a drive to display the teachings of Christ.




## Making YOOM for more stories

Here is a recap of some key milestones from last year:

- Tie in work (gas, sprinkler, plumbing) from existing to new building (Summer 2023)
- Civil works and parking lot upgrades (Summer 2023)
