Welcome to Maple Ridge British Columbia

Maple Ridge is a family-oriented community that provides an environment to learn, grow, and thrive. The city offers a diverse blend of established neighbourhoods, new residential developments, farmland, and green spaces, creating a safe and balanced setting for family life.

Maple Ridge offers convenient access to parks, recreation, shopping, dining, healthcare, and public transit. It is located one hour by car from Vancouver International Airport.



Our Programs

Maple Ridge Christian School is ranked within the top 10% of schools in British Columbia, according to the Fraser Institute school rankings. The school was built in 1956 and expanded with a new building and gym completed in April 2025.

Kindergarten to Grade 12 students learn on the same campus and positive cross-grade interactions are witnessed each day. Students in all grades spend time weekly in our school library. There are opportunities to experience fine arts (music, drama, and art) and physical activities all year round. Being a smaller school means teachers walk alongside students, giving individual support and mentorship.

Elementary (Kindergarten to Grade 5)

Early learning includes a mix of creativity, coaching, and connection. Students in our elementary program thrive academically and grow

in their faith while developing healthy social skills and a joy of learning.

Middle School (Grade 6-8)

These are years when youth discover and develop their strengths and passions. Students in our middle school program experience community as they learn through projects, collaboration, and exploration. Instruction in music and athletics are offered all year round.

High School (Grade 9-12)

Our graduates are proven to be problem solvers and critical thinkers who know how to work in teams and to relate to people of all ages. Teachers mentor students to dive deeper into academics, athletics, and the arts while engaging safely with technology. High school students have the opportunity to attend various educational field trips with their classmates.

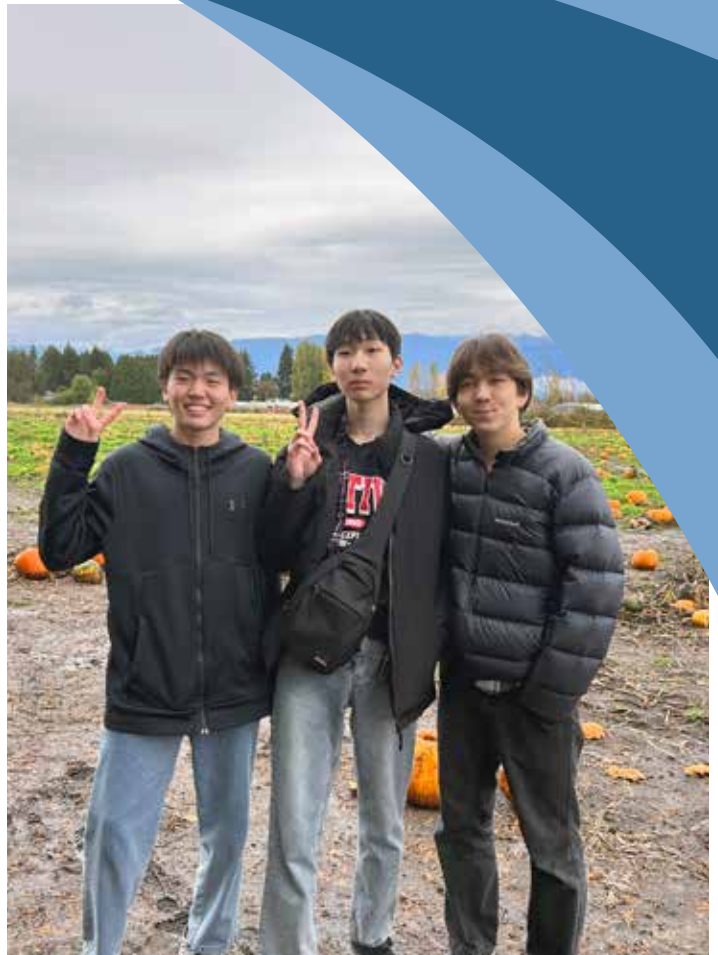
Our host families are an important component in the success of our international education program. Students grade 9 and older who are not living with their own family are placed with a host family. A host family provides a safe, secure, Christian environment for the student, ensuring consistency between the home and school. The student will attend a local church and participate in family activities and outings with their host family.

At the host home, the student will have a private room which includes a bed with bed linens, a desk, a place to store clothing, and access to laundry and bathroom facilities. Students are expected to contribute to keeping the home clean and tidy and grow in independence with life skills such as cooking and caring for oneself. Host families ensure limits are put on tech use, especially during the evening hours.

The host family provides the student with three nourishing, well-balanced meals each day (breakfast, lunch and dinner) plus snacks.

Daily transportation to and from school is provided for homes that are not within easy walking distance. If possible, transportation is provided to and from extracurricular activities.
