General Policies

Please Bring

1. A reusable water bottle (or purchase an MRCS water bottle).
2. A lunch and two healthy, nut-free snacks.

Camp-Appropriate Attire

1. Wear comfortable clothing and footwear.
2. Clothing with graphics must be respectful and reflect camp values.
3. Clothing must appropriately cover undergarments.

Camper Pick Up

To ensure the safety of all our campers, only individuals designated at registration are allowed to pick up campers, unless a parent/guardian provides a signed letter of permission (government ID may be required at pick up to verify identity).

Refund and Cancellation Policy

Refunds

If you need to withdraw your child from camp unexpectedly, refunds will be issued as follows:

Art Adventure Camp

- Week 1: July 13-17, 2026
- Week 2: July 20-24, 2026

- Cancellation on or before July 3, 2026: Full refund less a \$30 administration fee.
- Cancellation from July 4-10, 2026: 50% refund.
- Cancellation after July 10, 2026: No refund.

STEM Inventors Camp

- Week 1: August 10-14, 2026
- Week 2: August 17-21, 2026

- Cancellation on or before July 20, 2026: Full refund less a \$30 administration fee.
- Cancellation from July 21-30, 2026: 50% refund.
- Cancellation after July 31, 2026: No refund.



Camp Cancellation by MRCS

Summer camps require a minimum number of registrations to operate. If the minimum enrollment is not met, MRCS reserves the right to cancel a camp session.

In the event that a camp is cancelled by MRCS, families will receive a full refund of all fees paid.

No refunds or credits will be provided for missed days due to illness, vacation, appointments, or other absences.

If a child is registered for both weeks of the same camp, the refund will be calculated separately for each week based on the applicable cancellation date.



Behaviour Policies

Addressing Conflict

We seek to show kindness, patience, and forgiveness when addressing conflict. Please address any concerns directly with the Head instructor.

Harassment and Bullying

Our camp does not tolerate bullying and harassment and will address such behaviours with those involved.

All participants deserve a camp environment free from bullying, defined as acts of repeated aggression, verbal harassment, physical assault, and other subtler methods of coercion, such as manipulation and social exclusion.

All campers deserve a camp environment free from harassment, defined as any conduct, comment, gesture, or connotation concerning a person's race, religious beliefs, colour, place of origin, gender, mental or physical disability, ancestry, marital status, family status, source of income, age, sexual orientation or gender identity and expression which is:

1. Unwanted or may reasonably be considered unwanted
2. Offensive, humiliating, abusive, threatening and/or repetitive.

Dismissal Policy

We believe camp should feel fun and safe for everyone. The Head instructor reserves the right to permanently dismiss any individual who poses a risk to the safety and/or rights of others, or who appears to have disregarded camp guidelines. No refund will be issued for those who have been asked to leave.

Substance Use

Our camp strictly prohibits all staff, volunteers, and campers from possessing, manufacturing, offering for sale, selling, distributing, consuming, or using drugs, tobacco, vapour products, or alcohol during camp hours, whether on or off MRCS property.

Medical Emergency Policy

First Aid

In a medical emergency, our staff with first aid and CPR training will provide immediate care, as they are qualified. If needed, 911 will be contacted.

Contacting Parents

In a medical emergency, the primary emergency contact will be contacted. If the primary emergency contact cannot be reached, we will leave a detailed voice message as possible. If an ambulance is required and the primary emergency contact cannot arrive in time, a staff or volunteer will accompany the patient to the hospital, as hospital personnel allow.



Health Policy

Ongoing Health Needs

Individuals with ongoing medication or health needs require a camper-specific health plan arranged between the parents/guardians and the Head instructor.
